MSD Notice of Construction Completion

MT. ST. JOSEPH SEWER REPLACEMENT In Delhi Township, Hamilton County, Ohio

Cincinnati, September 9, 2008. The construction of the Mt. St. Joseph Sewer Replacement project was substantially completed June 5, 2008, by Charles H. Hamilton.

This project consisted of the installation of approximately 1,430 feet of 12-inch sanitary sewer, beginning at a manhole adjacent to Regina Hall on the Motherhouse property of the Sisters of Charity and extending northeastward to a manhole in an existing sewer just south of Wulff Run Road.

This project is part of MSD's ongoing Capital Improvement Program (CIP), which is focused on continually updating and improving the operation of MSD's wastewater collection and treatment systems.

Every day, the Metropolitan Sewer District of Greater Cincinnati (MSD) manages the effective collection and treatment of more than 200 million gallons of wastewater and actively maintains 3,000 miles of sanitary and combined sewers that run through the 49 municipalities and townships of Hamilton County. Owned by Hamilton County and operated by the City of Cincinnati, MSD is committed to continually maintaining and improving its wastewater collection and treatment systems for the betterment of both public and environmental health.
