
























Cincinnati Total Homicides & Nonfatal Shooting Victims January 1 – December 31


Fatal & Nonfatal Shootings (Victims)

Cincinnati Group Member Involved Homicides January 1 – December 31





Yearly Rolling 90-Day Shooting Victim Counts









CY2016 Recruit Classes

- 106th Recruit Class started 01.04.16 and will graduate 07.01.16 (26 weeks).
- 53 Recruits: two resigned, one before and one after the class started (expect about 10% loss).
- 31 m/w; 9 f/w, 6 m/b, 5 f/b, and 2 m/o. (58% m/w; 41.5% other).
- 107th Recruit class of 30 is scheduled as part of FY17 budget
