NOISE COMPLAINT REPORT – APRIL

During the month of April 2006, LUK received 13 contacts (phone calls, e-mails or walk-ins) from 5 individuals lodging 13 complaints and one inquiry. All of the complaints were time-specific. Complainants reporting specific complaints reported the following types of operations:

- 0 jet
- 2 prop
- 3 helicopters
- 7 unidentified aircraft
- 0 military
- 1 run-up

Reported disturbances (6) that were observed between the hours of 11 PM and 7 AM, at which time the tower is closed and voluntary restrictions are in effect, accounted for 50% of the aircraft disturbance complaints. The volume of complaints received in April 2006 (12 contacts/12 complaints) has decreased from April 2005 (16/20).

OPERATIONS

LUK operations decreased 14% in April 2006 (6068 ops.) compared with April 2005 (7064 ops.). Source of LUK operations information: Lunken Airport Air Traffic Control Tower reports.

LUK IFR operations decreased 26% in April 2006 (3435 IFR ops.) compared with April 2005 (4652 IFR ops.). In April 2006 IFR ops represented 57% of the total operations vs. 66% in 2005. Source of LUK operations information: Greater Cincinnati-Northern KY International Airport (CVG) Air Traffic Control Tower reports.

AIRSCENE NOISE MONITOR INSTALLATION STATUS

During the last week of March, Rannoch subcontractors installed the first of the five monitors at location number 4, the California Golf Course on Kellogg Avenue. Sites 1 and 2 (Alms and Armleder Parks) are ready for installation. Acoustical concerns necessitated changes to the monitor siting at sites 3 and 5 (Stanbery Park and Ft. Thomas). Staff identified alternative locations in the same general vicinities. Rannoch will review the alternative sites at the time of monitor installation at sites 1 and 2.

LUNKEN AIRPORT AVIATION DAYS - APRIL 28 & 29

Airport Aviation Days was sponsored by the Federal Aviation Administration, Lunken Airport, Ohio Aircraft Technicians Society, Kroger Company, and the Tri-State Warbird Museum to promote the aviation industry. Attendance is estimated at between 1,600 and 2,000 visitors. The exhibit and job fair was widely marketed to tri-state middle schools and high schools bringing over 800 students to Lunken. Promoters received encouraging feedback from many teachers accompanying the students on Friday. The event also received media coverage including the Weekender and Channel 19, which boosted Saturday's attendance.
