Mayor Mark Mallory to Speak at Mayors Innovation Project Meeting

Washington, D.C. – Mayor Mark Mallory will speak in Washington, D.C. this Saturday at a meeting of the Mayors Innovation Project. The Mayor has been invited to speak about his programs related to youth employment including Mayor Mallory’s Summer Youth Jobs Initiative and the Annual Youth Summer Jobs and Opportunities Fair. The Mayor has stressed the importance of youth employment and on the job mentoring throughout his administration.
