- To replace spoiled food purchased with food stamps, individuals must complete and submit to their county department of job and family services (CDJFS) a **“Statement Requesting Replacement of Food Stamp Benefits”** form within 10 days of the event that caused the food to spoil (in this case, Sept. 14) or, if the person was away from home, 10 days from when the food spoilage was discovered.
- Individuals can request an amount equal to the amount of food lost, but not exceeding the food stamp allotment for the month in which the disaster occurred.

Insulin Storage:

It is recommended that insulin be stored in a refrigerator at approximately 35 – 46 degrees F. Unopened and stored in this manner, these products maintain potency until the expiration date on the package. All of the available insulin products may be left unrefrigerated (between 59 to 86 degrees for up to 28 days and still maintain potency. People Working Cooperatively offers **critical home repairs** for low-income homeowners. Services are available in Hamilton, Butler, Warren and Clermont counties in Ohio. Availability of services vary by county. Must meet income guidelines. Emergency services for storm related damage include electrical and roofing repairs. Low-Income Family Aid/Disaster Assistance

Officials say Ohio disaster assistance and extra food stamps are available for needy victims of this week's wind storm and power outages. The state Department of Job and Family Services says families that can provide evidence of need may qualify for assistance of up to \$1,500, while elderly and disabled Ohioans may be eligible for a payment of as much as \$750. Applications are being taken at County Job and Family Services offices. The department also says food stamp recipients can replace provisions that spoiled due to a blackout. But they have to submit a form for the additional benefits.

- Families may qualify for up to \$1,500 in Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) disaster assistance. Certain elderly and disabled individuals may qualify for up to \$750 in disaster assistance.
- To be eligible for TANF disaster assistance money, families must include a minor child or pregnant woman and have evidence of economic need.
- Elderly or disabled individuals who are not eligible for TANF assistance may be eligible for disaster assistance if they are at least 55 years old and childless, if they receive certain disability benefits, or if they were adversely affected by the severe weather and can provide evidence of economic need. Only one payment may be made per dwelling.
- CDJFS offices will set eligibility criteria and take disaster assistance applications.

All Hamilton County residents can use one of the free yard-waste recycling drop-off sites 11:30 a.m.-5 p.m. Saturdays and Sundays until Nov. 30. The program doesn't accept yard waste from landscapers or businesses. The sites are Turpin Farms, 3295 Turpin Lane, Anderson Township; Kuliga Park, 6717 Bridgetown Road, Green Township; and the Rumpke Sanitary Landfill, Struble Road and Colerain Avenue, Colerain Township. The Rumpke location will also be open 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Wednesday through Friday. The Turpin Farm location is also open Monday – Friday 7:30 am – 6 pm. Leaves, grass clippings, brush, garden waste, tree trunks and prunings from trees and shrubs will be accepted at all sites. [Click here](#) for more information.

Anderson Township

Residents may put bundles of limbs no longer than four feet at the curb for pickup. Bundled limbs may also be brought to Turpin Farms, 3295 Turpin Lane, 7:30 a.m.-6 p.m. Monday-Friday and 11:30 a.m.-5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. Tree limbs may also be dropped off Tuesday behind Anderson Operations Center, 7954 Beechmont Ave. There will be no one at this site. The site will be marked by cones.

Arlington Heights

City employees collect yardwaste at the curb year round. Leaves must be placed in paper bags at curb. Larger brush must be bundled and placed at curb. For more information, contact [Arlington Heights](#) or 821-2076.

Blue Ash

Crews have started collecting yard debris. Residents should take limbs, branches and brush to the curb.

Cheviot

Residents should haul yard debris to the curb. Debris doesn't have to be bundled or cut to a certain length. Crews will collect debris until it is all picked up. Burning yard debris is prohibited.

Cincinnati

The city will pick up all types of yard waste, including clippings, leaves, branches, brush and limbs of any size. The debris must be taken to the curb. Crews will not go onto private property to pick up limbs. For information, call 513-591-6000.

Colerain Township

Residents can take yard debris to Colerain Township Senior & Community Center, 4300 Springdale Road;

Skyline Community Center, 8500 Pippin Road; or Clippard Park, 10243 Dewhill Drive, anytime from dawn to dusk until Sept. 28. Logs should be no longer than 4 feet. Rumpke will pick up debris if it is bundled or in a container if it is no longer than 4 feet and no heavier than 75 pounds.

Columbia Township

Residents put yardwaste at the curb and it will eventually be picked up.

Crosby Township

Residents can take yard debris to the Crosby Township Senior/Community Center, 8910 Willey Road, anytime from dawn to dusk until Friday, Sept. 26th. Following that, debris can be dropped off on Monday or Tuesday from 8am-4pm. For information, call the Center at 513.738.1440 or Harry Meyers at 513.317.1462.

Delhi Township

Now through Sunday, September 21, Delhi residents can bring tree limbs or branches that are less than 8 inches in diameter to the Township Senior Citizen/Community Center located on Neeb Road for disposal free of charge. No other type of debris (roof shingles, aluminum siding, etc.) will be accepted at this location. This facility is open between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. and is for Delhi residents only. Contractors will not be permitted to dispose of tree limbs or branches at this site.

Deer Park

A chipper goes around the City and branches that are placed at the curb will be picked up, no larger than 5" diameter.

Elmwood Place

Residents may mix grass and leaves with their regular trash. Limbs and branches must be cut to four foot lengths and tied up in an easy to handle bundle. Leaves are collected weekly from November to the middle of December if raked to the curb. Tree branches pulled to the curb will be picked up and it will be picked up eventually.

Evendale

Special pickups of limbs, etc. will be picked up and chipped everyday within the next two weeks. Have your limbs with the stalk end to the street by 7 am. Limbs and branches cannot exceed 8" in diameter.

The chipper CANNOT handle vines, garden waste, or wood with nails or bushes with an excessive amount of dirt on roots. Please remove the root ball from trees and bushes for pickup. All vines and garden waste should be in bags for Rumpke pickup. Grass clippings and leaves must be bagged and set out at the curb for pickup by Rumpke.

Fairfax

Maintenance Dept. is chipping branches that have been pulled to the curb.

Forest Park

Forest Park is operating a "Chipper Chipper" Program for brush and limb removal for this emergency. Call in's are not required. Each street will eventually be covered.

Glendale

Limbs and branches piled neatly are picked up at curb and are chipped. Larger branches, etc. (4" or larger) should be placed neatly in a separate pile at the curb.

Large limbs and branches should be placed at the curb for pickup. Manageable pieces should be placed at the curb for Rumpke.

Green Township

Township residents can drop off tree limbs at Kuliga Park, 6717 Bridgetown Road, and at the township's park property at 3990 Reemelin Road 9 a.m.-6 p.m. weekdays beginning today and from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. Only tree limbs will be accepted. Monday, 9/22/08, Department of Public Services crews will pick up tree limbs and brush that has been placed on the curb. It should be cut into lengths 6 feet or less.

Green Hills

Place branches and limbs at the curb and the chipper will eventually be by to chip. Rake up other debris and bag for Rumpke on regular garbage day.

Harrison (City)

Residents should pull manageable sized limbs and branches to the curb for chipping services. Brush drop off located on Industrial Drive is available the last Saturday of every month from 9am to 2pm. Rake up other debris and bag for Rumpke on regular garbage day.

Harrison Township

Residents should pull limbs and branches (8" or less) to the curb for pick-up. Brush drop off located on Industrial Drive is available the last Saturday of every month from 9am to 2pm.

Indian Hill

The Village will pick up storm related brush which homeowners have placed in an accessible location at no charge to residents. The Village will not pick up brush and debris which has been collected by private contractors. It may take 2-3 weeks for the Public Works department to pick-up collected brush. Call the department if you have any special needs related to storm debris.

Madeira

The city will collect all brush and debris over the next several weeks.

We want to emphasize that this service will take WEEKS! The amount of brush and debris will be overwhelming, so please be patient.

If at all possible, we would like you to separate the debris material into three "piles":

1. Regular brush and limbs (less than 8" in diameter and less than 8 ft. long)
2. Small debris/leaves
3. Large limbs and tree trunks/wood (greater than 8" in diameter)

Regular brush and limbs will be collected and chipped as usual. Limbs less than 8" in diameter will be run through the chipper.

You can place small debris and leaves in piles at the curb OR in PAPER lawn bags. If you use plastic bags, we will collect it with the large limbs later in the process. If you place the material in paper bags, we will be able to simply throw the bag into the chipper; plastic bags cannot be used in the chipper and will need to be collected separately. You can also place small debris and leaves in cans or boxes. We can then pick-up the container and empty it into the chipper. Again, plastic bags will not be collected when the chipper is being used.

If you decide to place the small debris and leaves in piles at the curb, we will collect it with a leaf vacuum. Please make certain that small debris material at the curb does not have large limbs or large sticks mixed in!

The leaf vacuums cannot pick up sticks and large objects. If the piles have large stick and limbs, we will be back at a later date and pick it up by hand.

Large limbs and tree trunks will be the last items collected. We will have to collect this material by hand. As you can imagine, this will be a slow and very time consuming process considering the amount of material that is expected to be collected.

The leaf collection program that was originally scheduled for mid-October will be delayed while we complete the storm debris collection. You can rake your leaves to the curb at any time but we will not be on a regular leaf collection schedule until the storm debris collection has been completed.

Mariemont

The Service Department will be making one trip down each street to pick up debris placed at the curb. No bags are required. Regular yardwaste guidelines apply after the initial pick-up.

Montgomery

Crews are out collecting storm debris. Residents should drag limbs to the curb and place them butt-end out. Rumpke will collect leaves on its regular schedule.

Springfield Township

Crews will pick up brush and tree limbs from curbs for the next several weeks.

Sycamore Township

Residents should take storm debris - excluding grass clippings and leaves - to the curb.

Symmes Township

The township will pick up debris next week. Residents should take the debris to the curb, then call 513-683-6644 for pickup.

Woodlawn

Woodlawn will accept limbs and branches from its residents at the Village's brush and yard waste site located on Mayview Forest Drive beginning Monday between the hours of 9 and 3. Limbs and branches must be no larger than 6 inches in diameter and 5 feet in length and must be bundled. If residents are unable to get these limbs and branches to this site, they can place them at the curb for pickup. The routine schedule for pickup is not in affect so it may take some time before items placed at the curb are collected.
