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1. CPD INTERN APPRECIATION LUNCH

2. 2012 LAW ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN

Ohio's 2012 Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics will take place on Wednesday, June 20, 2012. The Cincinnati to Springdale leg of the 2012 Law Enforcement Torch Run will begin at the Cincinnati Police Memorial at 0900 hours and proceed north, approximately 16 miles, to the Springdale Police Department.

The goal of the Law Enforcement Torch Run is to raise money and awareness for Special Olympics and to promote the positive image of law enforcement. Last year, Ohio's Law Enforcement Torch Run and related endeavors earned over \$520,000 for this worthy cause. Runners are encouraged to obtain a minimum of \$25 in sponsorship to cover the cost of their participation and to benefit Special Olympics. Participants can run, bike or skate as much of this route as they choose. Return transportation will be available during and after the run.

The Police Chief has approved the use of detail time for this event. With prior approval of district/section/unit commanders, on-duty personnel will be permitted to participate in the run. Off-duty personnel will not be compensated. Districts/sections/units will receive additional information and sponsorship forms. Advance application is not necessary. 3. SOUTHERN POLICE INSTITUTE APPLICATIONS

The Police Department is accepting applications for the 128th session of the Southern Police Institute (SPI) *"Administrative Officers Course."* The session begins on Monday, August 13, 2012, and concludes on Saturday, November 10, 2012. The course will be conducted at the University of Louisville, School of Justice Administration, in Louisville, Kentucky.

The course is designed to strengthen the leadership, knowledge, and skills necessary to manage and direct the resources of a police agency. Sergeants and above interested in the SPI course should prepare a Form 17 and submit it through the chain of command to Training Unit by Friday, June 1, 2012. 4. FBI LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED AND ASSAULTED SAFETY/STREET SURVIVAL TRAINING

The Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy (OPOTA) will be conducting a course titled *FBI Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted Safety/Street Survival*. The training will take place at the Police Academy on Thursday, August 16, 2012 from 0800 to 1600 hours.

This one-day course will examine 40 incidents where police officers survived life-threatening attacks. It will also offer insight on how officers may best protect their own safety.

There is no cost to attend this training. Personnel interested in attending the training must submit a Form 17 through the chain of command to Training Unit by Friday, June 1, 2012. Training Unit will complete the registration and notify personnel approved to attend. Officers may attend on-duty with the approval of their supervisor. No overtime will be provided for personnel attending this training. Attendees may wear casual business attire or the operational uniform. Questions regarding this training should be directed to Lieutenant Christine Briede, Training Unit, at 357-3562.

5. SEX TRAFFICKING INVESTIGATIONS TRAINING

The Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy (OPOTA), in collaboration with the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Northwest Ohio Violent Crimes Against Children Task Force, will be conducting a course titled *Sex Trafficking Investigations*. The training will take place at the Police Academy on Thursday, September 13, 2012 from 0800 to 1700 hours.

This one-day course will examine Human and Sex Trafficking as an emerging threat throughout the United States and a serious issue facing law enforcement agencies. Instructors will share their real-world experiences with these types of investigations. The course will cover juvenile and adult sex trafficking, common tactics and methods employed by perpetrators, indicators of trafficking, related state and federal laws, investigative methodologies, interviewing strategies, prosecution and available resources.

There is no cost to attend this training. Personnel interested in attending the training must submit a Form 17, through the chain of command to Training Unit, no later than Thursday, June 7, 2012. Training Unit will complete the registration and notify personnel approved to attend. Officers may attend on-duty with the approval of their supervisor. No overtime will be provided for personnel attending this training. Attendees may wear casual business attire or the operational uniform. 6. 2012 INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF CHIEFS OF POLICE (IACP) CONFERENCE AND LAW ENFORCEMENT EDUCATION AND TECHNOLOGY EXPOSITION

The International Association of Chiefs of Police will hold its 119th annual conference from Saturday, September 29, through Wednesday, October 3, 2012. The 2012 IACP Annual Conference will take place at the San Diego Convention Center, San Diego, California.

Sworn personnel at the rank of lieutenant or higher are eligible to apply for consideration to attend the IACP Conference. Attendance at the conference will provide the law enforcement executive with high-level, results-oriented educational sessions, networking opportunities, an open exchange of ideas, and insight to the latest technology advancements.

Eligible personnel with an interest in attending the 2012 IACP Conference must submit a Form 17 to the Police Chief, no later than Friday, June 1, 2012. The Police Chief's Office will select and notify those personnel approved to attend.

**SCHOOL CROSSING GUARD SANDRA JONES

On Monday, April 23, 2012, at approximately 2:15 pm, an incident took place at the corner of Glenmore and Schwartz Avenues where School Crossing Guard Sandra Jones was stopping traffic for pedestrians at the crosswalk.

The driver of a vehicle disregarded Crossing Guard Jones' hand signal and a red-light signal to stop, turning into the crosswalk where Crossing Guard Jones was standing. Due to Crossing Guard Jones' focused attention, she was able to move from the oncoming vehicle's path, while simultaneously ensuring that a student being guided across the street remained out of harm's way. Crossing Guard Jones was able to remain calm while writing down a partial license plate number and vehicle description; she then flagged down a police car to quickly report the incident.

School Crossing Guard Sandra Jones is to be recognized and commended for her diligence and dedication to excellence. Her heightened awareness and decisive actions potentially saved a life. Crossing Guard Jones is a credit to the School Crossing Guard Unit and the Cincinnati Police Department. Please accept my personal thanks and commendation.



Captain Neudigate,

On May 8th, just as night was falling, my thirteen year old daughter ran away from home. I had become aware of a very painful situation she was in at her school, and she became overwhelmed and fearful about having to face this I guess. So rather than talk, she ran. There had been no fight, and no harsh words. She just slipped away without a word, without her cell phone, without a destination as far as we knew.

It was terrifying and all the more upsetting because she had run away from Walnut Hills High this past December and had nearly overdosed on Tylenol. My daughter Mae is bright, beautiful, well-liked and has an extremely loving family. She has gone to great schools and had doting teachers. She seems, however, to be struggling with depression or bi-polar disorder, but it had been our impression and her therapist's that she was doing much better. We were shocked by this turn of events.

The 911 and District 5 response to our crisis was swift, thorough and compassionate. At no point did I feel judged, swept to the side or "handled." Everyone I came in contact with was incredibly professional, caring and appropriately responsive. I was assured that many officers were looking for her and there was a helicopter in the air within a short time after my 911 call. Mae had been gone less than an hour when I shared my concerns and no one made any moves to put me off or dismiss my worries. Though I'm sure your officers have seen many, MANY runaway situations resolve without incident, they did not assume that would be the case here, yet they were reassuring and kind.

In particular Sergeant Caton was an incredible presence on this night. He talked to me on his cell phone, kept me informed, and when it was long-past time for him to hand over this search to another officer (he had stayed on a couple of HOURS over?!), he came to my home to apologize for needing to hand over his duties and to personally reassure me that no one would stop looking until my daughter was found.

As we were talking, a call came from a restaurant employee in Hyde Park that they had found Mae! Rather than allow the Hyde Park police to handle things or the District 5 officer taking over for the night, he insisted on getting to participate in our happy ending and wrapping up the administrative work, and in the process lengthened his shift even further!

Sergeant Caton was kind, funny, empathic and very thorough and professional. I will feel forever grateful for his presence that terrible night, and I hope that if we see him again, it will be under happier circumstances!

In short, I am so very impressed with the Officers of District 5 with whom I have had contact. Our neighborhood liaison Lisa Johnson is also an incredible officer. Again, thorough, caring, professional. When Mae ran away from Walnut Hills, the officer we dealt with at that time (whose name, sadly, I forgot under the stress) was unforgettable. Thank you for all that you do to cultivate such a talented, caring force. My family is so very appreciative.





I would like to offer my commendation and appreciation to Specialist Jane Noel of the Personal Crimes Unit for her recent assistance. After two armed robberies of the same pharmacy, the detective assigned to the case reached out to your department for assistance with a sketch of the suspect. Specialist Noel offered her services.

Specialist Noel met with the pharmacist, who was the victim on both occasions. Through the efforts of Specialist Noel, we were able to publish a sketch of the suspect. The suspect was unique in that she was described as a young female. We received several tips after the sketch was published. One tip led to a suspect that was ruled out in large part due to the sketch.

In the early morning of May 5th, the suspect struck again in Ft. Mitchell, KY. As in previous robberies, she had received a large number of narcotics. She was stopped in Florence but refused to cooperate. I was able to watch the detectives interview the suspect. She denied all involvement until the detective presented her with the sketch. Her demeanor changed dramatically and she eventually confessed to three robberies.

I believe that Specialist Noel's efforts were instrumental in the resolution of these robberies. Please extend my appreciation to her. I would also like to thank the Cincinnati Police

Department for its assistance. We are fortunate that your agency does not hesitate to offer its resources to other agencies in the region. The results are a much safer community as a whole.
