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1. PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES PROHIBITED

The City of Cincinnati, Enterprise Technology Solutions (ETS) Department, Enterprise Email Team has detected a large number of personal devices and smart phones that are synchronizing to ETS servers to view City email messages. **The city's Information Security Policy prohibits personal devices of any type from connecting to any City of Cincinnati IT asset.**

Effective immediately, personnel are directed to remove any configurations on personal devices and smart phones that allow synchronization to the City's exchange email account. Examples of these devices are, but not limited to: iPhones, iPads, Droids and other tablets.

The content of any connected personal device may be wiped clean during maintenance and removal processes. This may result in possible loss of the personal data and configurations on your personal device. ETS is not responsible for any damage to personal devices during any maintenance and removal process.

Note: Waivers to the ETS policy are available for Elected Officials, Department Heads and Administration only.

ETS is reviewing a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) policy for future management of personal devices with the Law Department.

Web-based email access remains unchanged.




