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Cincinnati Paves the Way for Bikes

Dana Avenue receives dedicated street space for bicycle traffic

East-side drivers may have noticed a big change on Dana Avenue recently. The City of Cincinnati has installed bike lanes on Dana Avenue between Madison Road and Grigg Avenue. The bike lanes were installed as part of a "road diet"— seven motor vehicle lanes were reduced to five vehicle lanes and two bicycle lanes.

According to Michael Moore, Interim Director of the Department of Transportation & Engineering, "The City is working to utilize every opportunity we can to install bicycle facilities. Dana Avenue was an especially cost-effective opportunity for us because the street was already being repaved as part of the City's Street Rehabilitation Program."

The new bicycle lanes are 5 feet wide, striped on both sides, and are marked with a bicycle and rider pavement marking.
