After Mr. Dylon Ganious merged onto northbound I-75, Officer Ar'mon Shack followed Mr. Ganious for 5 – 10 miles before initiating a traffic stop. Mr. Ganious pulled to the shoulder and two additional cruisers arrived on scene. The officers pointed their firearms at Mr. Ganious and ordered him to exit the vehicle. An officer handcuffed Mr. Ganious, searched him, and placed him in the rear of a cruiser.

After approximately 10 minutes, Officer Shack explained to Mr. Ganious he was stopped because his vehicle was reported stolen; the officers had input his license plate information incorrectly. Mr. Ganious was released without citation.

Mr. Ganious believed there was “no excuse” to have the wrong license plate, as Officer Shack followed him for miles, and his inattention “created a dangerous situation for everyone involved.”

SUMMARY**

Mr. Stone alleged that on Thursday, December 30, 2021 at 4:35 p.m. at 2588 Westwood Northern Blvd., while driving, another vehicle attempted to enter his lane forcing Mr. Stone to move aside to prevent a collision. Due to the rainy conditions, this caused Mr. Stone to collide with a pole. A police officer later identified by CCA to be Officer James Broomes arrived on scene and spoke to the other driver but did not look at his vehicle, secure the other driver’s insurance, or note that the other driver was under the influence. Officer Broomes cited Mr. Stone for the accident before he obtained Mr. Stone’s version of events and would not talk to the two witnesses who observed the accident. The officer failed to fully investigate the situation before he issued a determination. Mr. Stone was concerned that the officer questioned him, despite his head injury, and did not ensure that Mr. Stone went to the hospital. The officer was condescending and discourteous during the encounter and Mr. Stone felt he was discriminated against as a “young black male.” Later the officer did not give Mr. Stone a court date or correctly file the citation, resulting in Mr. Stone suffering legal consequences.

Mr. Harris responded, "We are a small minority company; it is hard to find drivers in this business." Officer Carpenter replied in an angry tone, "Don't play that race card with me, don't put that race card in it." Mr. Harris finally commented that he repeated "minority" and it was not about race, then asked Officer Carpenter why he brought it up. Officer Carpenter walked away and stated, "the owner needed to get his [expletive] together and put money into his truck."

COMPLAINT SUMMARY

Mr. Robert Taylor alleged that on Wednesday, August 3, 2022 at 9:40AM at [REDACTED] Cincinnati Police officers later identified by CCA to be Sergeant Asbury, Specialist Longworth, Officers Knapp and McGrath, used excessive force when arresting him. Sergeant Asbury, Specialist Longworth, and Officers Knapp and McGrath, along with several more members of the Fugitive Apprehension Squad, arrived at [REDACTED] to serve multiple warrants on Mr. Robert Taylor, including warrants for Carrying Concealed Weapon, Improper Handling of a Weapon in a Motor Vehicle, Failure to Comply with a Police Order, Weapons under Disability, Tampering with Evidence and Felony Obstructing Official Business (Hamilton County Common Pleas Case 22CRA11774). Mr. Taylor also alleged that the officers made fun of his prosthetic eye, and they “should have” obtained a “search warrant” to search the residence he was located at because it is his children’s residence, and he “does not live there.”

R2311: Body Worn Camera Usage

CCA recommends that CPD include in Procedure § 12.540, Body Worn Camera System, a provision requiring officers who are assigned to work the front desk of police districts to activate their BWC’s, or another comparable video and audio recording device, for contact with citizens, regardless of whether the officer is engaged in “self initiated activity.” Over the years, CCA has received numerous complaints regarding contact that citizens have had at the front desk of police districts, and recording these encounters via BWC is likely to either confirm or refute such complaints.
