Sec. 809-1. - Antique Dealer Defined.

"Antique dealer" shall mean any person, firm or corporation engaged in the business of selling, exchanging, bartering or keeping with the intention of selling, bartering, or exchanging any antique. For the purpose of this section antiques shall include ceramics, paintings, jewelry, gold or silver articles, oriental rugs, tapestries, embroideries, statuary, furniture, household furnishings or other objects of art, which because of age, history, design or workmanship have a trade value greater than their utilitarian value.

Sec. 809-3. - License Required.

No person, firm or corporation shall carry on the business of antique dealer without obtaining a license therefor from the city treasurer for each place of business operated by such person, firm or corporation except that auctioneers duly licensed under the provisions of Chapter 811 of the Cincinnati Municipal Code need not obtain a license under the provisions of this chapter.

Sec. 809-5. - License Fees.

The annual license fee to be paid to the city treasurer by any person, firm or corporation carrying on the business of antique dealers shall be \$175.00 for the period of one year following the application for each place of business.

Whoever violates Section 809-3 shall be fined not more than \$300.
