Subject: **Amended 2019 3rd Quarter Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Report**

## **Background**

The 2019 3rd Quarter Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Report was submitted on February 4, 2020 (Item No. 202000096). At the request of the Budget & Finance Committee, the report was amended to include data for both the first three quarters of 2019 and to include the data reported for the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter in each of the previous years. This Amended 2019 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter SBE Report contains the information originally reported in Item No. 202000096 as well as the supplemental data for the previous quarters and years as reflected in Tables I.A. and I.B., respectively.

## **Third Quarter Results**

The quarterly SBE reports allow the City Administration to make an assessment of where it is in meeting the annual categorical goals and to strategize or plan for the months to follow. This quarterly report is being provided pursuant to CMC 323-1-S3. The City's aspirational annual SBE goals for City spend are 30% construction, 15% professional services and 15% supplies/services. Of the total City spend in Hamilton County for competitively let contracts in the third quarter of this year, which totaled \$42,542,116.59, certified SBEs, SLBEs and ELBEs received 4.02% of the construction spend, 2.99% of the professional services spend, and 11.29% of the supplies/services spend, which represents an overall participation of 5.31% (\$2,259,332.23) of the total City spend for all contract categories.

While the SBE program is a race- and gender-neutral program, the Department of Economic Inclusion tracks expenditures with SBEs by race and gender for those SBEs that voluntarily provide race and gender information. Of the total SBE spend in Hamilton County, 4.96% was paid to firms that self-identified as male- and minority-owned, 21.06% was paid to firms that self-identified as female- and minority-owned, 57.74% was paid to firms that self-identified as male- and Caucasian-owned, 15.14% was paid to firms that self-identified as female- and Caucasian-owned, and 1.10% was paid to firms that did not declare gender and/or ethnicity.

The City is statutorily required to pursue SBE participation on City contracts and report quarterly on utilization activity. This requirement precedes the City's new M/WBE

Inclusion Program, on which we have and will continue to provide periodic reports. By design, the M/WBE and SBE policies and activities complement each other with an eye toward achieving overall balance between race/gender and non-race/gender objectives of the City inclusion values.

Additional detail regarding SBE spend, certifications, and outreach and capacity building is provided in the attached report.

## **Amended 2019 3<sup>rd</sup> QUARTER SBE REPORT**

Presented by the City Manager and

## I. INTRODUCTION

This is the Amended 2019 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter SBE Report.<sup>1</sup>The City of Cincinnati's Small Business and Local Business Enterprise Program is a race -and- gender neutral program that complements the City's race- and -gender-conscious Minority and Women Business Enterprise Program to maximize inclusion in City contracting. While the City historically has had a Small Business Enterprise (SBE) program, Chapter 323 of the Cincinnati Municipal Code was amended effective January 1, 2016 to, among other things, add a local business component with 2 additional certifications: Small Local Business Enterprise (SLBE), and Emerging Local Business Enterprise (ELBE) as defined below.

The data reporting contained herein is strategically focused on City spending linked with competitive transactions. It represents the spending associated with City contracts that were awarded through a competitive process for the purchase of goods and services, after the exclusion of certain categories of expenditures not considered for SBE, SLBE and ELBE spend reporting purposes. The quarterly reports will allow the City Administration to track performance in meeting its aspirational goals for SBE participation in City contract spend of 30% for construction, 15% for professional services, and 15% for non-professional services and supplies. The annual report provides cumulative data for the entire calendar year. All data reported herein is for the period July 1, 2019 through September 30, 2019.

## II. DEFINITIONS

For purposes of this report, key words are defined by the Department of Economic Inclusion (DEI) as follows:

*"Certified Spend"* means total dollars paid to SBEs, SLBEs or ELBEs, less Exclusions.

*"Emerging Local Business Enterprise" or "ELBE"* means those independently owned and operated for-profit businesses with either a principal place of business<sup>2</sup> or a significant employee presence<sup>3</sup> within the geographic limits of the City of Cincinnati that have been in existence for fewer than five years, have had no more than 5 full-time employees at any given time, have had annual gross receipts averaged over the life of the business of no more than \$250,000, have not received more than \$250,000 in city payments in the year preceding the application for certification, and meet the other criteria of CMC § 323-1-E1.

<sup>2</sup> A principal place of business is a headquarters or physical office from which at least 50% of the gross revenues of the business are coordinated and generated. CMC § 323-1-P1.

<sup>3</sup> A business has a significant employee presence in the City if at least 25% of the total full- and part-time employees are domiciled within the City. CMC § 323-1-S2.

*“Exclusion”* means (1) those expenditures that, by their nature, do not occur on a competitive basis;<sup>4</sup> (2) those expenditures made to non-profits, other public agencies or to excluded vendors;<sup>5</sup> (3) expenditures associated with object codes within the City’s coding system that do not fall into the classifications of construction, professional services, or non-professional services/supplies; and (4) voucher payments associated with utilities, travel, interdepartmental and “Finance use only” expenditures. Expenditures excluded during the 3rd quarter of 2019 are shown in Attachment V.

*“Small Business Enterprise” or “SBE”* means those independently owned and operated for-profit businesses with fixed offices in Hamilton County for at least a year that have been in existence for at least one year, have had annual gross receipts and a number of employees averaged over the immediately prior 3 years that do not exceed the SBA size standards, have no owner (including spouse) with a personal net worth in excess of \$750,000, and meet the other criteria of CMC § 323-1-S3.

*“Small Local Business Enterprise” or “SLBE”* means those independently owned and operated for-profit businesses with either a principal place of business or a significant employee presence within the geographic limits of the City of Cincinnati that have been in existence for at least one year or have owners with at least 3 years of relevant experience, have had no more than 35 full-time employees at any given time during the immediately prior 3 years, have had annual gross receipts averaged over the immediately prior 3 years of no more than \$1,000,000, have not received more than \$500,000 in city payments in the year preceding the application for certification, and meet the other criteria of CMC § 323-1-S4.

*“Total City Spend” or “Total Spend”* means total dollars paid to all vendors, less Exclusions.

### **III. 3rd Quarter 2019 SBE, SLBE and ELBE CERTIFICATION**

As of September 30, 2019, there were 181 certified SBEs<sup>6</sup> in a pool of approximately 14,210 vendors registered to do business with the City. The SBEs represent only about 1.27% of the total registered vendors. Although DEI continues regularly to process and approve both new and renewal SBE applications, this is an increase of just one in the number of firms with an active SBE certification as compared to the end of the second quarter of 2019, which is still significantly less than the total number of certified SBEs as compared to the years prior to the implementation of the MBE/WBE program. Some previously certified SBEs no longer meet the SBE program’s personal net worth criteria for certification eligibility due to the financial success achieved by the owners of those firms. Other firms, that also are eligible for MBE or WBE certification, have elected not to provide the personal financial information needed for SBE consideration since they can be considered for certification under the MBE/WBE program

without providing personal financial statements or personal income tax returns. Because the two programs offer very different contracting advantages, DEI continues to educate firms about each program and to encourage firms to submit the documents necessary for consideration for each certification type for which they may be eligible.

Of the 181 certified SBEs, 26 (14.36%) also are certified as SLBEs, and 6 (3.31% of all SBEs) are certified as both SLBEs and ELBEs as well. In addition, there are 12 certified SLBE firms that elected not to submit the personal financial statements required for SBE consideration, 3 of which also are certified as ELBEs. If there are a sufficient number of SLBEs certified for work under a particular commodity code, appropriate contracts with a value of no more than \$250,000 can be let through the Sheltered Market Program in which competition is limited to City-certified SLBEs. Sheltered Market opportunities also are available for City-certified ELBEs for appropriate contracts valued at \$50,000 or less. DEI is focusing renewed outreach efforts toward SLBE- and ELBE-eligible firms with the goal of identifying at least one Sheltered Market procurement in FY2020.

The SBE, SLBE and ELBE programs are race- and gender-neutral programs. However, certified firms are permitted to voluntarily self-identify ethnicity. A total of 65 (35.91%) of the firms certified under the Small Business Enterprise and Local Business Enterprise Programs of Chapter 323 self-identify as African American. Eight (4.42%) report their ethnicity as Asian, Asian-Pacific American, or Subcontinent Asian American, and 1 (0.55%) identifies as Hispanic American. There are 107 firms (59.12%) that self-identify as Caucasian. As of September 30, 2019, there were no firms that declined to provide ethnicity information.

Only those businesses geographically located within Hamilton County are eligible for certification as an SBE, provided they meet the other criteria set forth in CMC § 323-1-S3. Therefore, to accurately gauge progress toward meeting SBE goals, it is appropriate to compare SBE spend only with total City spend in Hamilton County.

#### **IV. 3rd Quarter SBE, SLBE and ELBE SPEND**

##### **A. General SBE, SLBE and ELBE Spend**

From July 1, 2019 through September 30, 2019, 5.31% of the total City spend in Hamilton County was paid to SBE, SLBEs and ELBEs. The breakdown by contract type was 4.02% for construction, 2.99% for professional services, and 11.29% for non-professional services and supplies. SBE, SLBEs and ELBEs located within the geographical boundaries of the City of Cincinnati<sup>7</sup> received 4.45% of the overall spend in Cincinnati, 2.88% of the construction spend, 2.47% of the professional services spend, and 16.44% of the

<sup>7</sup> The distinction between the City of Cincinnati and Hamilton County for spend reporting purposes is made by zip code, rather than by street address. For each zip code which lies partially within the City and partially outside the City, a determination had been made by DEI as to its classification as a City or County zip code solely for purposes of this spend breakdown by location. DEI utilizes a site-specific determination of location for the purpose of certification eligibility.

non-professional services and supplies spend. Attachment I compares the total SBE/SLBE/ELBE spend to the total City vendor spend, broken down by geographic boundaries and by contract type.

This same 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter 2019 data for spend in Hamilton County also is shown in relation to spend in Hamilton County as reported in the first two quarters of 2019 and as reported in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter of each year 2017 – 2019 in Attachments I.A. and I.B., respectively. However, it is difficult to draw conclusions when making spend comparisons between individual quarters within a single year or for a single quarter over multiple years. Spend data, while reported as a snapshot on a given date, is a fluid number. While prime contractors are required to enter payments to their subcontractors by the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month following the month in which the payments are made and subcontractors are required to confirm those payments within 30 days thereafter, it is not uncommon for spend to be entered and/or confirmed after the close of the reporting period. Variables such as procurement cycles, departmental budgets, and the timing of capital projects can further complicate such comparisons.

Attachment IV provides a further breakdown of SBE spend by department. These reports are generated through the VCCS system supported by the B2Gnow software.

#### **B. SBE, SLBE and ELBE Spend by Race and Gender**

Although the SBE program is a race- and gender-neutral program, DEI tracks and reports by race and gender City expenditures with certified SBEs, SLBEs and ELBEs that have voluntarily provided race and gender information through the certification application process.<sup>8</sup> Of the total SBE/SLBE/ELBE spend in Hamilton County, 4.96% was paid to firms that self-identified as male- and minority-owned, 21.06% was paid to firms that self-identified as female- and minority-owned, 57.74% was paid to firms that self-identified as male- and Caucasian-owned, 15.14% was paid to firms that self-identified as female- and Caucasian-owned, and 1.10% was paid to firms that did not declare ethnicity. Attachment II provides a more detailed demographic breakdown of total SBE/SLBE/ELBE spend by voluntarily identified race and gender.

As compared to total City spend, 0.26% was paid to firms that self-identified as male- and minority-owned, 1.12% was paid to firms that self-identified as female- and minority-owned, 3.07% was paid to firms that self-identified as male- and Caucasian-owned, 0.80% was paid to firms that self-identified as female- and Caucasian-owned, and 0.06% was paid to firms that did not declare gender and/or ethnicity. Attachment III provides a more detailed demographic breakdown for the comparison with total City spend.

#### **C. SLBE and ELBE Spend**

Of the total SBE, SLBE and ELBE spend reported herein, \$8,600.00 was paid to an SLBE firm that elected not to submit the personal financial statements necessary for SBE certification consideration. No payments were made this quarter to any firm with an ELBE but not an SBE certification.

## V. OUTREACH AND CAPACITY BUILDING HIGHLIGHTS

During the third quarter of 2019 DEI continued to engage in several outreach efforts to encourage eligible businesses to apply for certification and to help build the capacity of those businesses to perform on City contracts. This was especially true as DEI collaborated with some of its community partners and local public and private organizations to help small businesses in the region expand their opportunities.

A component of sustaining a structure for continued economic inclusion within the region is DEI's Information and Resource Sessions, formerly known as the Business Training Center. These classes are designed to help small, minority-owned and women-owned businesses better position themselves to take advantage of City procurement opportunities. The concept and success of the Information and Resource Sessions has encouraged several of our business and community partners to begin offering classes tailored toward each of their own niches, which is continuing to expand the knowledge base available for our certified firms.

During the third quarter of 2019, DEI held six Information and Resource Sessions. Two classes were on *"Making City Certification Work for You."* This class provides an overview of the City's various certification programs, eligibility requirements, the distinct advantages of each certification type, and the obligations and responsibilities of certified firms. Participants have an opportunity to ask questions regarding applications, the purpose of application document requirements, and how to leverage their City certifications. Additional classes consisted of two sessions on *"Doing Business with the City of Cincinnati."* The Division of Purchasing, along with DEI, explain the differences between Invitations to Bid, RFPs and RFQs, answer questions about the various forms that must be submitted with a bid or response, and address difficulties vendors experience with the solicitation process.

A new session DEI created out of the need to provide additional resources to contractors and subcontractors who are actively working on City projects is *"Navigating On-Line Payroll Submissions for Prevailing Wage Projects."* This class is for businesses that perform work on City projects subject to state, federal or local prevailing wage laws. DEI staff provide hands-on training on the use of LCPTracker, the on-line system for submitting payroll reports. Contractors are encouraged to send the administrative personnel responsible for payroll submissions for both an initial training and refresher trainings as often as needed.

The final class held during the third quarter was held at the FC Cincinnati MLS Stadium construction site. This was a special *"Certification and Contract Compliance"* class rolled into one for businesses interest in working on the FC Cincinnati project. This class included information on the various City certifications and goals set by the City on the project. More than 50 business owners attended this meeting to gather information and to get questions related to certification and compliance answered. This was followed up one week later with an *"FC Cincinnati Construction Connection"* meeting where FC Cincinnati began rolling out upcoming bid opportunities, discussed ways for companies of all sizes to get involved, introduced key people with whom to connect, and reiterated the value of being certified by the City of Cincinnati as part of the effort of working on this multi-million dollar project.

In July, DEI, along with the African American Chamber, US Small Business Administration-Cincinnati Branch Office (SBA), Ohio Minority Business Assistance Center (MBAC), and the Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED), held its second annual *“Contacts to Contracts: Cincinnati Means Business.”* This half-day business event, held July 18 at Xavier’s Williams College of Business, provided more than 75 small business owners a chance to meet one-on-one with procurement managers from both the public and private sector as well as to attend workshops that addressed finances, networking, tax laws, and acquiring and retaining talent. A post-event survey found 95% of those who attended made positive connections at the event, had plans to follow-up with businesses they met, and would seek certification with the City of Cincinnati and/or the State of Ohio.

Contacts to Contracts is one of two big events planned and held annually by the nucleus planning committee of DEI, the African American Chamber, the SBA, MBAC, and DCED. The other, A Celebration of African American Small Business Achievement & Resource Exhibit, will be held during the last week of February in 2020.

In August, DEI attended and took part in Fifth Third Bank’s annual Supplier Diversity Summit. This annual summit gives Fifth Third a chance to discuss goals set/achieved for the year, allows businesses to network, meet and greet among the bank’s diversity team, plus take part in a pitch competition and matchmaker session.

DEI understands the value of working with our local development community and participates in events that allow City-certified and non-City-certified firms opportunities to engage with prime contractors and developers committed to inclusion on their projects. Such was the case as DEI worked with Cincinnati State and Goldman Sachs to promote and encourage businesses to apply for the Goldman Sachs 10,000 Small Businesses program here in Cincinnati. The program is designed to help entrepreneurs create jobs and economic opportunity by providing greater access to education, capital and business support services. Goldman Sachs kicked off its program September 9th with Mayor John Cranley and Cincinnati State President Dr. Monica Posey. The 10,000 Small Businesses program will begin in February 2020, and it will be held on the Cincinnati State campus. In a separate event, DEI presented information on the City’s certification program as part of the Cincinnati Metropolitan Housing Authority (CMHA) discussion on the Park Eden project. DEI is proud of our long-standing partnership with CMHA and sharing project information with City-certified firms. Park Eden is part of CMHA’s multi-million-dollar renovation of all its housing projects across Hamilton County.

DEI, the SBA, and the Hispanic Chamber have been meeting over much of 2019, discussing ways to increase business opportunities for Hispanic-owned companies. During the summer those discussions turned into plans of action, which culminated with the September 19<sup>th</sup> Hispanic Small Business Community Outreach event at Xavier University’s Williams College of Business. The outreach event was geared primarily toward the Hispanic business community and included close to a dozen financial institutions, businesses and community services agencies open to working with and helping Hispanic businesses thrive and grow. Guest speaker, former NFL great and entrepreneur Anthony Munoz, discussed how he began

his own business, the hurdles he had to overcome, and suggestions on ways small businesses can be successful in the Tri-State area.

Finishing out the month of September was the Plumber's Fair presented by Greater Cincinnati Water Works (GCWW). The goal of this event was to inform plumbers across the City about how to become an integral part of the Lead Service Line Replacement Program (LSLRP) and play an important role in replacing private side lead lines in the City of Cincinnati. DEI was one of several City departments on-hand to answer questions of those who attended the event.

In the third quarter, DEI was honored to participate on a panel assembled by the Ohio Secretary of State, Frank LaRose. An audience of 50 African American entrepreneurs attended the panel discussion to hear and share thoughts and ideas about doing business in Ohio. Secretary LaRose also shared his plans for expanding business services and resources to better support business growth in the state. DEI Director Markiea Carter participated as one of the panel members.

DEI is continuing to share information on the work it performs, the partners with which it works, and business success stories through its public affairs show, Gateway to Economic Inclusion. Topics and guests who appeared during the third quarter include: Small Business Community Outreach – Guests Robert Sparks from U.S. Bank, Everett Woodel, Jr. from the SBA, and Alfonso Cornejo of the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce; Goldman Sachs 10,000 Small Business Program – Guest Jim Lay; and Spotlight on Minority Businesses – Guests Calista Smith, owner of Scale Strategic Solutions, and Lester Boyd, owner of Lestar Mineral Development, Inc.

## **VI. CONCLUSION**

The quarterly reports provide a snapshot view of how the City is progressing toward reaching its annual SBE goals. The information gathered each quarter is used to strategize for the coming months. These reports are SBE-specific and do not address certified MBE or WBE spend or certified MBE/WBE award, both of which are separately reported for those programs.
