Subject: Enhanced Flood Debris Removal Operations in Targeted Neighborhoods

The Department of Public Services (DPS), in coordination with Metropolitan Sewer District (MSD), will begin an enhanced storm debris removal operation today, Monday, July 20, 2026, to support ongoing recovery efforts in several of the communities most impacted by recent heavy rain and flooding.

Priority areas for this operation include:

- Hyde Park
- Oakley
- Madisonville
- California

Operations will be conducted systematically to maximize debris removal and improve neighborhood conditions as efficiently as possible. City staff will continue to monitor conditions throughout affected areas and identify locations with significant debris accumulation requiring collection and disposal.

To support these efforts, DPS has increased operational resources dedicated to debris collection, hauling, and street cleanup activities. Roll-off containers are also being deployed throughout the affected communities to facilitate debris disposal. A roll-off container has already been stationed at **4420 Camberwell Road** in Hyde Park, with additional roll-off containers scheduled for deployment in the remaining targeted neighborhoods beginning July 20.

Residents are encouraged to report significant debris accumulations, blocked roadways, drainage concerns, or other storm-related issues through 311. Service requests can be submitted by calling 311, calling (513) 765-1212, or using the Cincy 311 website or mobile application.

DPS will continue to evaluate operational needs and adjust resources as necessary to support recovery efforts across impacted neighborhoods.
