US EPA Grant - Brownfield Assessment Survey

The City of Cincinnati has a US EPA Grant to identify and assess brownfield sites and create clean-up and reuse plans in the Lower Mill Creek Valley. This includes the neighborhoods: Lower Price Hill, Queensgate, East Price Hill, South Fairmount, North Fairmount, English Woods, Millvale, South Cumminsville, Camp Washington, and Northside.

A **Brownfield** is a "real property, the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant".

We are reaching out to the community in these neighborhoods to identify and get feedback on which properties are most important to you. The goal of the grant is to work with the community to identify and assess properties and create plans for clean-up and re-use. We hope to identify the steps needed for the property to be developed into something the community wants.

The types of properties we want to find are:

- Distressed: under severe disrepair or dilapidation
- Contribute to public safety concerns
- Contribute to environmental contamination
- Vacant or a magnet for criminal activity

Large properties to be reused as businesses
Properties with unoccupied buildings
Vacant (empty) lots
Properties which contribute to public safety concerns
Properties with a history of criminal activity
Small properties near community assets (ex: Parks, Schools, Churches, etc)
