

C.I.T.I. CAMP MISSION STATEMENT

C.I.T.I. Camp is designed to encourage, inspire, motivate and challenge youth to excel on all levels of social and personal growth. We will develop participants' self-confidence as well as teach respect for themselves and others. We will enable them to learn how to resolve conflict. We desire for all participants to be academic achievers, model students and effective leaders in their schools and communities.

Student Introduction to Camp

Students will participate in a 10 week program. Each participant will receive a camp personnel roster, which will list the duties of each Officer.

Students:

- Will address instructors as sir & ma'am
- Are addressed as a young man and lady
- Will be given a schedule outlining the tasks and time each will be performed on a daily basis
- Will be given written rules as well as the consequences for breaking these rules
- Are provided uniforms
- Are expected to report on time
- Are expected to successfully complete the minimum Physical Ability Test: push-ups, sit-ups, and complete a 1/2 mile run

C.I.T.I. Camp Graduation Requirements

- 100% Participation.
- Continuous improvement in attitude and leadership qualities.
- Pass written tests on weekly theme words.
- Successfully complete the Physical Ability Test.
- Maintain a respectful and academic relationship with school and NO EXPULSION.
- C.I.T.I. Camp Advisors must receive a positive Parent Behavior Report from parent or guardian reference youth at the end of program.

Parent to Parent Program

- Parents will meet with a Parent Coordinator to talk about any and all issues at home.
- Parents or a representative are required to attend 10 Parent to Parent sessions.

- Express appropriate language and use positive forms of communication

- Seek help in resolving problems with other students and adults
- Honor the dress code

Criteria for Juveniles to be assigned in C.I.T.I. Camp

- Juveniles with social and personal challenges
- Juveniles assigned to Diversion Court
- Juveniles with Unofficial Hearing Offenses
- First time Minor Misdemeanor and/or Misdemeanor offenders
- Juveniles assigned to Probation for Minor offenses
- Juveniles with Minor Offense, Unruly and/or Minor Mental Health issues being treated
- Juveniles with no offense but referred by Parent and/or Guardian
- Parent and/or Guardian participation is required
