

Introduction

On August 7, 2022, three people were shot in the densely packed entertainment area of Cincinnati, known as the DORA at the Banks. This happened despite officers staffing the area at the time of the incident. This was not the only shooting incident, before or after. It was also not the only time shots were fired near police.

This area was designated as a DORA (designated outdoor refreshment area) in March of 2021. Central Business Officers' concern for violence and other criminal activity here steadily grew through 2022 and into 2024.



Problem Identification


Central Business Section officers scanned this issue and preliminarily identified the problem as: "Groups of juveniles and young adults gathering and creating their own block parties, often leading to disorderly activity and violent behavior."


Analysis

As detailed analysis began, investigators focused on two zones. The larger Dora and Smale Park Zone makes up the entire Dora area in downtown Cincinnati. This area extends from the professional football stadium on the western edge of the business core's riverfront, to the baseball stadium and arena on the eastern end. Second, investigators focused on a smaller zone within this area, known as the Plaza at the Banks. This is the most concentrated bar and weekend entertainment area, on East Freedom Way between Walnut Street and Joe Nuxhall Way.




Analysis of 2022 through early 2024 supported the officers' concerns that crime, and particularly violence, was escalating here. 123 offenses were reported here in 2022, and 141 offenses occurred in 2023, a 15% increase. In 2023, twelve aggravated assaults occurred here. Offenses occurred most frequently during the summer, on weekends, and during peak entertainment district hours.






Calls for police service also reflected significant demand, with more than 200 calls to the Plaza at the Banks portion of this area, and hundreds more calls to the larger Dora and Smale Park footprint.



Responses

The following responses were implemented to confront this problem:

- Supplemental high visibility staffing by CPD's SWAT and CDRT teams
- A Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) assessment was conducted late in 2023, and presented to Banks Community Authority in January of 2024
 - Changes at the DORA have included:
 - Removed public seating areas
 - Secured outdoor seating when businesses are closed
 - Building owners' approval to add camera installations
 - \$120,000 approval for new lighting and landscape alterations
 - Cincinnati Parks has:
 - Explored additional lighting options on Marian Spencer Way steps to Smale Park
 - Considered additional signage displaying Smale Park hours at entrance points
- A tow truck detail was established to quickly address hazardous and egregious parking violators, to keep more organization and to preserve public safety access in this high density and sometimes disorderly environment
- DOTE and CPD consulted with e-scooter companies to "geofence" this area, preventing scooters from operating in this pedestrian area
- Discussions are ongoing regarding place management practices







Assessment
